A message from the Community Spiritual Director

John 7:37-39: "On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." The word "Thirst" Jesus speaks of is a metaphor referring to the thirsting for the water of the soul, a spiritual meaning. The thirsting of the soul may be anxiety of the soul, conviction of sin, desire to be forgiven and cleansed.

The only remedy for this kind of thirsting is to come to Jesus. Jesus declares that He is the true fountain of life. He is the supplier of all spiritual needs and all spiritual wants. He offers the gift of salvation to all who will come to Him, acknowledging their sins and accepting Him as their personal Savior. There is nothing more important than being forgiven of all sins and receiving eternal life. Thus, John explains, "But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive." The ministry of the Holy Spirit is very powerful in those who participate in the Great Banquet. He teaches us, energizes, transforms us, convicts us and cleanses us from all sin to renew us in fellowship with God.

It is significant that Jesus spoke about rivers of living water on the last day of the feast. This was the day the Jews celebrated and worshiped God for the fruit of the vine, olive, barley, and wheat. They thanked God for the rain from which none of these crops would have grown. Jesus, therefore, used the analogy of rivers of living water as an offer that He will give to those who come to Him. There was another significant rite done during the feast. For each day a golden pitcher of water was drawn by the priests from the pool of Siloam. The priests would take this water through the Water Gate into the Temple grounds. All the while the people recited Isaiah 12:3, "With joy you will draw water from the well of salvation."

The water was carried up to the Temple altar and poured out as an offering to God. While this was being done, the Levite choir would sing The Hallel (that is, Psalms 113-118) accompanied by flutes. When the choir came to the words, "O give thanks to the Lord," (Psalm 118:1) the worshippers shouted and waved their palms toward the altar. This was probably the time Jesus cried out and offered living water. Let us be thankful that we are experiencing the ever-flowing power of the Holy Spirit.

Elohim Persons who have attended Awakening or Chrysalis only!

The Elohim Board has been delinquent in the following requirement and apologizes for this oversight.

Elohim Great Banquet was started under the charter granted from the Decatur Great Banquet organization with the condition Elohim will follow the requirements of the charter.

If a person has attended an Awakening or Chrysalis and would like to work a Great Banquet weekend, they must have attended a Great Banquet weekend first. The Awakening and Great Banquet weekends are similar in the 3-day experience, but the talks are not the same subject matter and the content is designed for adults.

A person who has attended the Awakening or Chrysalis and not a Great Banquet weekend may still attend the Sponsor's Hour, Candlelight and Closing of the Great Banquet.

This requirement was effective on the Spring 2017 weekends and we encourage any person who has only attended an Awakening or Chrysalis to plan on attending a Great Banquet weekend.



GREAT BANQUET - Luke 14

The Great Banquet concept is patterned around the parable from Luke 14:15-24. Jesus tells of a master who prepared a great banquet and invited many guests, saying "Come, for everything is now ready." After many excuses for not attending, the master becomes angry and orders his servants: "Go quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame."

After this has been done and room still remains, the master tells his servants: "Go out to the roads and country lanes and make them come in, so that my house will be full." Then, as additional invitations are given, the banquet is presented to his guests. The result of the master's invitation was to feast and fellowship at a banquet given by God.
